Vensiam: A Journey of Resilience and Purpose

Vensiam grew up in Bukpi Village, where her early life was marked by hardship. Her father struggled with addiction and passed away in 2009. Soon after, her mother moved the family to Lamka, determined to give her children a better future despite limited means.

In 2018, tragedy struck again when Vensiam's mother was diagnosed with breast cancer. She passed away later that year, leaving behind four children. Her older brother became the family's sole provider through daily wage work, while Vensiam focused on her studies.

She found meaning in teaching and mentoring young people. Since 2021, she has been a science teacher at St. Paul's Institute, using her role to support and guide students.

Driven by her experiences and a desire to help others through emotional and mental challenges, Vensiam has now taken the next step. She applied to SAIACS to pursue training in counseling and leadership, continuing her journey of turning pain into purpose.

However, financial constraints again became a concern. But support came through the love and care of Brother Peter and his wife, Sister Mai, who have generously stepped in to sponsor her education. We are truly grateful for their kindness, love, and unwavering support.

We wish Vensiam all the very best in her studies and future endeavors!

New Development in Finance for Lainat Ministry:

We have implemented Tally accounting software in our finance and record-keeping systems to improve accuracy, efficiency, and transparency in financial management. This upgrade also helps us meet legal and compliance requirements more effectively.

It represents a significant improvement over our earlier use of Microsoft Excel, which had limitations in automation and scalability. However, we have not entirely discontinued spreadsheets—they are still used alongside Tally as a backup and redundancy measure to ensure data security and cross-verification.
