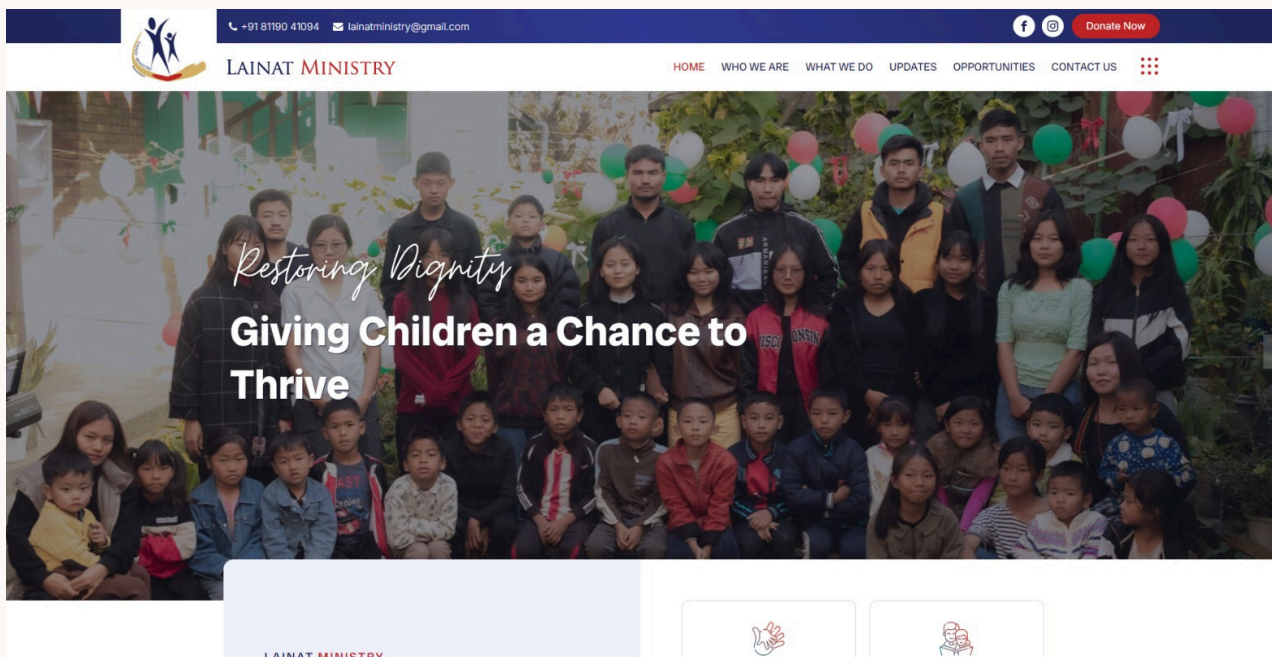


## Lainat Has Its Own Website!

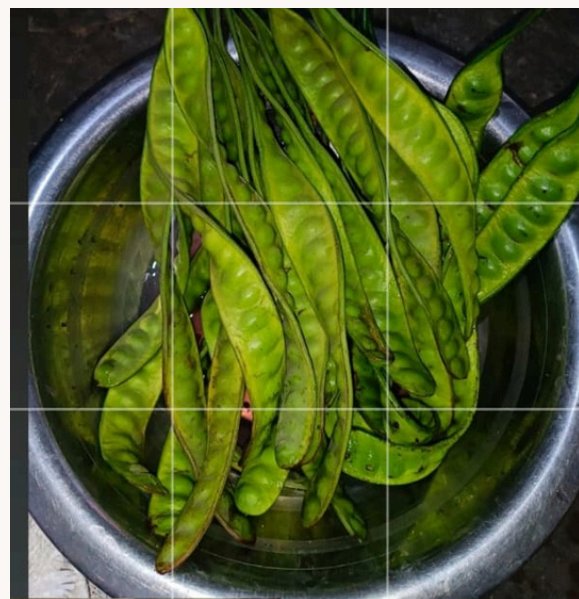

## *Updates on current situation of Lamka*

- **Incidents of Violence:** On the night of 22nd March, there was an episode of violence in Lamka, very close to Lainat Home, just 3–5 minutes' walk (around 1,000–1,300 feet) from our premises. Fortunately, these incidents have occurred only at night. Even so, it has been a stressful time for everyone. While the authorities are present in the area, the tension and uncertainty have made daily life more challenging.
- **Theft and Security Concerns:** Recently, two LPG gas cylinders were stolen from Lainat Home, one full and one in use. This unfortunate incident reflects a broader rise in thefts in the town. The increasing number of thefts, along with a growing issue of drug abuse is affecting the community.
- **Impact on Our Children:** Most of the children currently under our care come from families affected by drug abuse, where one or both parents struggle with substance dependence. Many of these children have experienced neglect, instability, or exposure to unsafe environments at home. In some cases, one or two of the children's fathers are homeless and living on the streets, while a few others are currently in rehabilitation centers.

Through all of this, your support remains a source of hope. It allows us to continue providing a safe environment, meals, education, and care to the children, despite the difficulties in the wider community. Your generosity makes a tangible difference in helping these children feel safe, valued, and loved during times of uncertainty.
